

Mark Halx's Critical Theory

Assitant Professor Mark Halx states, "This commentary piece is based primarily on my ongoing research interest in critical theory, critical pedagogy, and critical thinking. I was also inspired by feedback from my How We Think Gateway class here at Illinois Wesleyan." The abstract says, "This article is an exploration of the potential of a more purposeful application of criticality in undergraduate classrooms. Conventional pedagogy, often lecture-based, does not prepare students well for life, a career, or service toward the common good. A more critical approach in the classroom stimulates critical thinking, critical consciousness, and critical being. Criticality in teaching and learning allows for an honest assessment of history, culture, and the reality of human interactions" (2022).

Sharing your Scholarship!

SelectedWorks is the faculty and staff-focused portion of IWU's Digital Commons. It enables users to create a personal webpage to highlight their scholarly work. A SelectedWorks profile will enhance the discoverability of your publications, presentations, and research projects. Results from SelectedWorks often rank higher than other types of websites in search engine results. The included Author Dashboard allows you to access metrics including number of times materials were downloaded and where the downloads geographically originated from.
