shy charisma and hushed, literate balladry, she combines insightful lyrics and soulful energy into her music. Curtis writes about a wide range of

issues including domestic violence, corporate greed, religion,

homelessness, peace, and gay rights.

Curtis has toured with Lilith Fair, and with artists such as Dar Williams and Mary Chapin Carpenter. Her songs have appeared on numerous television shows such as *Dawson's Creek*, *Felicity, Chicago Hope*, and *Alias* and independent films such as *500 Miles to Graceland and A*

Slipping Down Life.

Curtis continues to tour, headlining clubs, theaters and acoustic listening rooms, building a strong fan base around the United States and Europe. She is currently touring in support of her latest recording, *Dreaming in Romance Languages* on which she ties her intimate landscapes to broader

themes of spirituality, community, and lasting love.
