Anderson Inducted into Sociology Honorary Society at IWU

BLOOMINGTON, Ill. - Matthew Anderson of Mt. Prospect, Ill. was among eight Illinois Wesleyan University students inducted into Alpha Kappa Delta (AKD), the International Sociology Honor Society, in a ceremony held on Thursday, March 31.

Anderson, a graduate of Mt. Prospect High School, is a senior biology major and sociology minor.

AKD is an organization dedicated to promoting excellence in scholarship in the study of sociology, research of social problems, and other social and intellectual activities that lead to improvement in the human condition. Since 1965, the IWU chapter of AKD has been open to sociology majors and non-majors based on academic performance.

Illinois Wesleyan, founded in 1850, is a private co-educational university with an enrollment of 2,100 and a student/faculty ratio of 12 to 1. The University consists of the College of Liberal Arts, with 17 academic departments; the College of Fine Arts, comprising professional Schools of Art, Music, and Theatre Arts; and the School of Nursing. Illinois Wesleyan's faculty is composed of active scholars who are devoted to teaching undergraduates and to including them in their research.
