## **Comedian Jay Black to Perform at Hansen Student Center**

Black started out as a high school English teacher before deciding that comedy was his calling. In the past year, he has toured over 100 colleges and performed in clubs all over the country. He has been featured on Showtime, Fox Business Channel and A&E. As a screenwriter, Black has worked on several feature films.

Black was recently voted by *Campus Activities Magazine* to be the Reader's Choice for 2008's Comedian of the Year. His style of comedy has been described by critics as "observational, but also very personal," and contains "a creative take on our absurd existence."
