BLOOMINGTON, Ill. - Illinois Wesleyan's International Studies Program will sponsor a "Hunger Banquet" on Thursday, March 31, at 5:30 p.m. in the Davidson Room of the Memorial Center (104 E. University St., Bloomington).

The Hunger Banquet will represent the inequality of nutrition and caloric intake around the world. For instance, someone may be served a steak dinner or a bowl of rice, depending upon whether they represent a citizen from a rich country or a poor country.
