Vance Gilbert to Perform at IWU's Blue Moon Coffeehouse

BLOOMINGTON, Ill.--Contemporary acoustic guitarist Vance Gilbert will perform a two-set concert at Illinois Wesleyan University's Blue Moon Coffeehouse, Saturday, Feb. 26 at 8 p.m.

Free and open to the public, the concert will be held in the Main Lounge of Memorial Student Center, 104 E. University Ave., Bloomington.

Doors open at 7:30 p.m. Flavored coffees, herbal teas and light pastries will be available.

Gilbert, a former jazz singer, is known for his smooth, full-bodied voice and thoughtful, heartfelt lyrics. The *Boston Globe* describes Gilbert as "that rare performer for whom people lean forward in their seats as eagerly between songs as they do during them. These 'Vance-Heads' see him over and over again, always expecting to be surprised, never being disappointed."

Gilbert's first two albums, *Edgewise* (1994) and *Fugitives* (1996), have found significant niches on New Adult Contemporary and Adult Alternative radio.

In 1998, Gilbert released his third album, *Shaking Off Gravity*, on the Rounder/Philo label. Recorded at his home in Boston and using state-of-the-art technology, Gilbert took time to hone his guitar and vocal performances to a razor-sharp edge.

"This album is full of pops, clicks, hisses and flubbed notes. It is also full of performances," said Gilbert. "This is the one I've always wanted."

Gilbert, the 1997 Kerrville Music Award's Vocalist of the Year, has shared the stage with such performers as Aretha Franklin, Jay Leno, Bill Cosby, Arlo Guthrie, Mary Chapin Carpenter, Joan Baez and Shawn Colvin.
