Illinois Wesleyan University to Benefit from \$25,000 GTE Foundation Grant

BLOOMINGTON, Ill.--Illinois Wesleyan University has received a grant of \$25,000 from the GTE Foundation.

Mary Feicke, GTE's area manager for customer operations, delivered the check on behalf of the Foundation to Jo Porter, IWU's director of corporate and foundation relations, on May 3.

The grant will be used to replace 24 workstations in IWU's Internet Computer Laboratory, located in Sheean Library.

"The 24 computers in Sheean's Internet Laboratory have an average of 30 seconds between users," according to the funding proposal IWU submitted to the GTE Foundation. "This facility is also used for required technology instruction for first-year students."

These computers are used to link IWU students to millions of volumes of material available through electronic catalogs and inter-library loan systems. The Illinois Library Computer System, for example, is a network of more than 50 Illinois college and university libraries whose on-line catalog provides access to the 22-million volumes held by those academic libraries, as well as 750 public and special libraries in the state.

"Broader access through technology and inter-library loan programs," IWU's proposal pointed out, "has created greater efficiency in use of collections among both college and public libraries. Primarily, college libraries no longer have to duplicate collections at all levels."

The grant to Illinois Wesleyan is part of more than \$30 million the GTE Foundation will contribute to educational and charitable institutions this year. Total contributions to local organizations so far this year have totaled more than \$60,000.
