Event: Blue Moon Coffeehouse featuring Karen Savoca with special guest Don Conoscenti

Date: Saturday, Oct. 28

Time: Doors open at 7:30 p.m. and performances usually consisting of two sets begin at 8 p.m.

Background: Like the rarity of a blue moon, the Blue Moon Coffeehouse at Illinois Wesleyan University brings out the hidden musical artists of the folk genre that not many get the opportunity to see.

Promotional materials say Karen Savoca "blurs the lines between styles, bringing soul and funk accents to the pop-folk confessional song." Savoca attended Syracuse University where she met guitarist Pete Heitzman and formed a partnership. Savoca's enchanting voice and Heitzman's guitar skills combine for a dynamic duo that performs with what has been described as a "fearlessness of a high wire act working without a net." Together they have recorded four albums: "Here We Go," "Sunday in Nandua," "On the River Road" and "Walkin' the Bridge."

Don Conoscenti writes and sings a mix of stories and songs about lovers, outcasts, healing, murder and redemption. Fans find he has a "clear, vibrant voice, facile guitar style and a storyteller's eye for emotional detail." Conoscenti has played with Tom Paxton, Ellis Paul and David Wilcox. He has been named Musician of the Year in Atlanta, Acoustic Artist of the Year, the winner of the Rocky Mountain Folks Fest Songwriting Competition and was a finalist with the National Academy of Songwriters.
