Background: The program will include Pohadka (A Tale) by L. Janacek; Sonata, op. 69 by Beethoven; Sonata, op. 65 by Chopin, and the Illinois premiere of "Tanya" Poems by J.L. Zaimont.

Reminikova and Braginski are professors at the University of Minnesota School of Music.

Reminikova graduated from Moscow Conservatory, where she studied with Matislav Rostropovich. She has recordings of Prokofiev, Shostakovich, Stravinski, and Britten on the DDF and Sound Star Tone labels, and has performed in the concert halls of London, Moscow, Bonn, Jerusalem, Brussels, Frankfurt, Florence, Taipei, Shanghai, and throughout the United States. Reminikova also has been a soloist with the Israel Philharmonic, Jerusalem Symphony, Minnesota Orchestra, and Orchestre nationale de Belgique.

Braginski has studied with Alexander Goldenweiser and Theodore Gutman. His repertoire extends from baroque to avant-garde. Braginski, who has premiered the works of composers around the world, has also given master classes in Germany, Vienna, and at the Aspen Music Festival. He also has been a judge at the International Piano Competition in Vienna, Rome, and Senigallia.
