**Program:** Assistant Professor Leonard J. Clapp will explore: "Is it Possible to have Religion without the Wires?"

**Background:** Clapp is an assistant professor of philosophy at Illinois Wesleyan University. He has degrees from the University of Wisconsin, Madison and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. Clapp also has taught courses at MIT and Harvard. His published articles have appeared in several books and journals including *The Journal of Philosophy and Linguistics* and *Philosophy*.

Clapp's presentation will focus on his beliefs about what we hold to be the founding principles of religion and how they may not be true. In support of his view, Clapp will discuss a cross displayed in the center of an ellipse in the front of Evelyn Chapel, which seems to float in mid-air, and how upon close inspection viewers will see that the cross is really hung by a complex set of invisible wires.
