Background: Reverend Carol Lakota Eastin, a missionary assigned by the general board of global ministries of the United Methodist Church to the Illinois Great Rivers Annual Conference, will present "Facing the Four Directions: A Path to Healing."

Eastin leads Native American ministries and aims to create an intertribal community for teaching about Jesus Christ and expressing a faith that affirms cultural identity.

With Muscokee Creek elder John B. Haikey, Eastin started the Native American Fellowship in 1993. The community now includes more than 350 people within a 100-mile radius.

Eastin received a bachelor of arts degree in music education and psychology from MacMurray College in Jacksonville. She earned master's degrees in theology and Christian education from Methodist Theological School in Delaware, Ohio and in counseling psychology from Illinois State University.
