**Event:** Summer Cello Camp at Illinois Wesleyan University

**Date:** July 15-29

**Time:** 9 a.m.-3 p.m. each day for cello study with optional recreational activities from 6-9 p.m.

**Location:** IWU School of Music, Presser Hall, 303 E. University Ave., Bloomington

**Admission:** The cost for the camp is \$315 for Bloomington-Normal area residents. Housing and meals for out-of-town students are available at additional costs.

**Background:** Under the direction of Nina Gordon, IWU assistant professor of cello and chamber music and former principal cellist of the Kansas City Symphony, the camp is open to high school and junior high school cellists who wish to participate in two weeks of intensive cello study.

The program will include daily private cello lessons, ensemble coaching, cello choir, master classes and performances. Elective studies including piano and voice lessons, acting, drawing, American and African dancing, Chinese language and music theory are also available for participants.
