METAL-URGE art exhibition on display at Illinois Wesleyan

BLOOMINGTON, Ill.--On exhibit from Tuesday, Oct. 2 until Thursday, Nov. 1 in the Merwin Gallery at Illinois Wesleyan University, will be an exhibit called METAL-URGE, featuring diverse approaches by seven contemporary artists working with metal.

The exhibit is free and open to the public at the Joyce Eichhorn Ames School of Art Building, 302 E. Graham St., Bloomington. Gallery hours are Monday through Friday, 12-4 p.m., Tuesday, 7-9 p.m., and Saturday and Sunday, 1-4 p.m.

There will be an informal gallery talk in the Merwin Gallery on Oct. 2 from 4-5 p.m. that will allow the public to meet some of the artists featured in METAL-URGE and hear what they have to say about their works.

There will be an opening reception on Tuesday, Oct. 2 from 5-6 p.m.

The exhibit will feature sculptures from artists Cecilia Allen, Melanie A. Feerst, Valerie Gilman, Michele L. Goldstrum, ROY, Laura Stoland, and Melanie J. VanHouten, all of whom use metal as their primary material. Some of the work in the show is cast, while other pieces are fabricated.
