Background: The Symphonic Winds is one of two performing concert bands within the School of Music at IWU, composed primarily of non-music majors, and employing between 45 and 55 IWU students. The group performs at least once each semester on the IWU campus.

Roger Garrett, IWU assistant professor of clarinet/music education, is conductor of the Symphonic Winds. He will be joined by guest conductor William Long for this event.

Garrett has been a professor at IWU since 1988, and graduated with distinction from the University of Michigan with multiple degrees in music education with extensive study in the areas of clarinet performance and instrumental conducting. Before coming to IWU, Garrett taught instrumental music in the public schools of Longview, Washington and Bozeman, Montana.

Guest conductor William Long is currently associate professor of music and director of bands at Newberry College in Newberry, South Carolina. Long directs the marching, concert and jazz bands at Newberry, and teaches instrumental conducting and music pedagogy classes.

Long is a graduate of Black Hills State University in Spearfish, South Dakota and the University of Northern Colorado in Greeley.

The program will include works by composers John Philip Sousa, Aaron Copland, Jerry Bilik, Robert Jager, Johann Sebastian Bach, Frank Ticheli, and Henry Fillmore.
