BLOOMINGTON, Ill. – The Council on International Educational Exchange (CIEE) has selected four Illinois Wesleyan students to participate in a week-long program at Yonsei University in Seoul, South Korea.

The Illinois Wesleyan participants in this program are Ryan Nielsen, a sophomore international studies major from Woodridge, Ill.; Katie Sill, a sophomore international studies and English-writing major from Highland Village, Texas; Ivy Craig, a first-year international studies major from McLean, Ill.; and Aoife O'Connor, a first-year international studies major from Rochester, Minn.
