School of Theatre Arts to Present *Hello Again*

BLOOMINGTON, Ill. – The Illinois Wesleyan University School of Theatre Arts will present *Hello Again*, with music and lyrics by Michael John LaChiusa. Performances will take place at McPherson Theatre (2 Ames Plaza East, Bloomington) at 8 p.m. Nov. 15-19, with a matinee at 2 p.m. on Nov. 20. **This musical is intended for an adult audience and contains mature themes, sexual simulation and illegal drug use. It is not intended for students under the age of seventeen.**



Tickets became available for purchase Monday, Nov. 7. General admission is \$12 for performances Tuesday through Thursday, and the Sunday matinee. Friday and Saturday performances are \$14. Senior citizens receive a \$1 discount off the general admission price and students may purchase tickets for \$2 with a valid Illinois Wesleyan ID.

Based on the 1897 play *LaRonde* by Arthur Schnitzler, *Hello Again* focuses on the love affairs among ten characters that take place during different decades of the 20th century. Placing the vignettes in a non-chronological order, the show contains a wide range of musical styles, while encompassing musical and lyrical elements that tie the characters and their experiences together.
