BLOOMINGTON, Ill. — The Illinois Wesleyan University School of Theatre Arts will present Josh Tobiesen's *Election Day* Thursday, Oct. 20 through Saturday, Oct. 22 at 8 p.m. in the E. Melba Johnson Kirkpatrick Laboratory Theatre (304 E. Graham St., Bloomington).

Tickets for *Election Day* are available for purchase at the McPherson Theatre Box Office. General admission and senior ticket prices are \$3. Student tickets are \$2 with a valid school ID. Due to the use of strong language, the play is recommended for mature audiences.

Election Day portrays the story of Adam, a young man whose political enthusiast girlfriend, Brenda, is struggling to convince him to fulfill his civic duty by voting; Cleo, his sex-starved sister who associates with eco-terrorist Edmund; and of course, the mayoral nominee himself, Jerry Clark. *Election Day* not only questions the credibility and candidness of political platforms, but of personal ones as well.

Director Allison Sutton, a senior theatre arts major, hopes that audiences will see in this play the extent to which Americans, regardless of party affiliation, are willing to go for that ultimate vote.
