## New Leadership for Multicultural Student Affairs

BLOOMINGTON. III.—George E. Jackson, III has been named director of Multicultural Student Affairs at Illinois Wesleyan University. He began work on July 1.

A native of Indiana, Jackson comes to the University from Fort Hays State University in Hays, Kan., where he was the coordinator of diversity affairs. He received a bachelor of arts degree in communications and theatre arts from Taylor University in Upland, Ind. and a master of science degree in student affairs in higher education from Colorado State University.

According to Karla Carney-Hall, vice president of student affairs and dean of students, Jackson has provided diversity leadership at several institutions including Butler University (Indianapolis, Ind.) and Messiah College (Grantham, Pa.). At Fort Hays, Jackson supervised the support services for students of color in partnership with the Center for Student Involvement as well as advised students and collaborated with campus constituencies to design and facilitate diversity-related educational programs and activities for students, faculty, staff and the Hays community.

On June 1, Tonya Daniel joined Illinois Wesleyan University as assistant director for Multicultural Student Affairs.

A native of Alabama, Daniel earned a bachelor of arts degree in religious studies and philosophy from the University of Alabama. She worked in the non-profit sector for six years before returning to the University of Mississippi for her master of arts degree in higher education and student personnel.
