Student Composition Concert

BLOOMINGTON, Ill.— On Friday, Dec. 6, Illinois Wesleyan's School of Music will present a Student Composition Concert. The event, which is free and open to the public, will be held at 7:30 p.m. in Westbrook Auditorium of Presser Hall (1210 N. Park St., Bloomington).

As part of the New Music Series, which features 20th century and contemporary music, the concert allows students to showcase their compositions. The December performance will feature 10 pieces.

The concert will open with junior Luke McLoughlin's *Reflection*, followed by *Prelude and a Kiss*, which will be sung by four students, and sophomore David Flowers' *Solo for Horn and Piano*.

Other pieces include sophomore Timothy McDunn's *Movement IX from 'Hamlet,'* sophomore Joseph Bakke's *English Horses*, junior Madz Negro's *An Exchange*, and sophomore Brady Poole's *Tennessee Dreams*.

The concert will conclude with *Don't Listen To This Song* by senior Abby Lyons, *Your Girlfriend Would Hate This Song*, which will be performed by seven students on various instruments, and *Last Call for Sleep* by first-year student Ryan Donlin.

Flowers, Negro, Bakke, Poole, Lyons and Donlin will also perform some of the compositions on instruments and voice.
