BLOOMINGTON, Ill.— On Thursday, November 14, Illinois Wesleyan University's School of Music will present the Symphonic Winds and Jazz Lab Ensemble Concert. The concert, which is free and open to the public, will be held at 8:00 p.m. in Westbrook Auditorium of Presser Hall (1210 N. Park St., Bloomington).

Roger Garrett, assistant professor of music, is the conductor for Symphonic Winds and Timothy Pitchford, assistant professor of music, directs the Jazz Lab Ensemble.
