## May Term Strives to Make Human Rights Real

BLOOMINGTON, III.— Illinois Wesleyan students participating in May Term can attend multiple co-curricular events throughout the month, such as concerts, film screenings and workshops, which encompass the theme of "Making Human Rights Real."

Along with the events, there will also be a "Making Human Rights Real Interactive Wall" in The Ames Library (1 Ames Plaza), located on the entry level to the left of the circulation desk. Developed with the help of design student, Agnes Kubas, the wall will serve as a common forum where students can post comments, poetry, and images that relate to human rights and social justice. See a **poster** (pdf). Students can also participate in a **photo contest** by submitting photos that best represent their May Term experience.

May Term is a month-long opportunity for students to enroll in one intensive class that encompasses an entire semester's worth of material and earns them one class credit. On-campus May Term classes enable students to fulfill general education requirements, as well as take classes that would not typically be available to them during the fall and spring semesters, such as "Song and Dance in Latin America," "Field Ornithology" and "Greek and Roman comedy." There are also multiple travel courses that allow students to study abroad in Italy, the U.K., France, Hawaii, Germany and Bulgaria.

This term's programming is the result of a joint effort by staff and faculty from the following offices: May Term Office in collaboration with the Mellon Center Advisory Committee, Dean of Students Office and the Chaplain's Office.
