The students will also read and discuss *Huey: Spirit of the Panther* by David Hillard. Participants who successfully complete the program will also be awarded a scholarship.

Matthew Damschroder, assistant dean of students, Colin Stewart, director for student activities and leadership programs, Laurie Diekhoff, assistant director of the Hart Career Center, and Galvez assessed numerous candidates before determining who would qualify for the program.

"This program allows for a community to be built and it enables our students to know that Wesleyan supports them and we are invested in their success," said Galvez.
