Joe Anderson '68 has been named president of Seniority, Inc., a provider of management, sales and developmental consulting to senior living communities throughout the United States.

A wholly owned subsidiary of ABHOW, a senior housing and healthcare provider in the western United States, the firm currently manages five communities, with two more scheduled for opening by 2016.
