
BLOOMINGTON, III.— The Illinois Wesleyan University Wind Ensemble is one of only three finalists nationwide in The <u>American Prize</u> competition in the performing arts.

The 30-member group is a finalist in the Band/Wind Ensemble Performance, college/university division. Judging was based on submissions of audio and video recordings of the group's performances.
