BLOOMINGTON, Ill. - Illinois Wesleyan University Chaplain Dennis E. Groh and Professor of History Michael Weis will host an all-university discussion chapel hour on Wednesday, April 6, at 11 a.m. in Evelyn Chapel (1301 N. Park St., Bloomington).

The topic for discussion, titled: "Red States, Blue States: Should Religion Divide the Red, White and Blue?" is based upon the 2004 presidential election vote. Groh and Weis, in analyzing the election, found that a huge number of voters said they voted based on either moral or religious reasons.
