Tickets go on sale May 15 and are \$ 3 for general admission, \$ 2 for seniors (65 years and older), and \$1 for students.

Fun, by Howard Korder, will be directed by Zach Bosteel, a senior acting major from Marietta, Ga. The story is about two teenage boys trying to find a way to end their boredom in a small city. It is a story of friendship and loyalty, looking deep into the modern American teen.
