Illinois Wesleyan Welcomes 12 First-Year National Merit Scholars August 30, 2006

BLOOMINGTON, III. — Of the 558 Illinois Wesleyan University first-year students, 12 are National Merit Scholars. The National Merit Scholarship Program recognizes approximately 8,200 high-school finalists out of 1.3 million PSAT/NMSQT entrants with an award, up to \$2,000, for their academic abilities, skills, and accomplishments. The program is an independent non-profit organization that operates without government assistance.

The National Merit Scholars enrolled at IWU as first-year students are:
