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Lab Theatre to Present Into an Unlulled Sleep

Written collaboratively by student Nolan Kennedy and director Sven Miller, the play is a charged experience of American oppression, exploitation and injustice, with an eye to the Bloomington-Normal community. Cast members spent time at area soup kitchens to understand the experiences of being in a different social class. In addition to the student actors, the performance will also feature clients of the homeless shelters, Home Sweet Home and Safe Harbor in Bloomington, who will give their own accounts of exploitation.

Drawing from the theatrical styles of Heiner Muller and Pina Bausch, the physical and atypically blunt performance style sets the production apart as not only questioning the mechanics of society, but the mechanics of the theatre itself.
