BLOOMINGTON, Ill. - Four Illinois Wesleyan religion majors will join Jennie Edwards Bertrand, the director for Illinois State University's Wesley Foundation, a United Methodist Campus Ministry, to give a chapel service on February 14th at 11 a.m. in the Evelyn Chapel (1301 Park St., Bloomington).

The event at Illinois Wesleyan University is free and open to the public.
