## Blue Moon Coffeehouse to Feature Folk Musician

BLOOMINGTON, Ill. – Jess Klein will give a concert at the Blue Moon Coffeehouse on Saturday, Nov. 17 at 8 p.m. in the Memorial Center Main Lounge (104 E. University St., Bloomington). Doors open at 7:30 p.m.

Known for “lyrics that alternate between searing and heartbreakingly vulnerable, and a gritty, primal production style,” Klein began playing guitar and writing songs while studying abroad in Kingston, Jamaica during college.

“One day I sat down and was working on the three chords I knew, and I just started writing a song,” said Klein in an interview for the *Boston Globe*. “I realized that was my unique gift: the ability to think of a song and write and perform it.”

Klein has recorded seven albums, the most recent of which, *City Garden*, was released in 2006. She has also toured internationally, playing at festivals such as SXSW, the Sundance Film Festival, and Japan’s Fuji Rock Festival.
