Scholarship Fund Established

BLOOMINGTON, Ill. – A scholarship fund in memory of Kildeer, Ill., resident Jack W. Whitley has been established to support scholarships for Illinois Wesleyan University students.

Whitley, who passed away on July 12, 2007, was a 1975 graduate of Illinois Wesleyan with a degree in political science. During his time on campus, Whitley was president of the IWU chapters of Theta Chi Fraternity and Blue Key National Honors Society, a member of the Student Senate, a staff member of the student newspaper *The Argus* and one of the first station managers of the student-run radio station, WESN. An athlete at IWU, Whitley lettered in both football and track.

After graduating from Illinois Wesleyan, Whitley earned his master's degree in communications from Illinois State University in Normal, Ill., and law degrees from Drake University in Iowa and Georgetown University in Washington, D.C. He worked as an attorney for the Federal Communications Commission and several law firms before taking the post of director of regulatory affairs for the Cellular Telecommunications Industry.

Whitley was a member of the Barrington United Methodist Church where he served on the administrative council and preschool board.
