After a brief intermission, Muriello will perform *On the idle hill of summer* by George Butterworth, *É la solita storia del pastore* by Franceseco Cilea, *Psyché* by Émilie Paladihe and *En Sourdine* and *Pysage sentimental* by Claude Debussy.
