BLOOMINGTON, Ill.— Illinois Wesleyan University's Sigma Tau Delta will hold its annual Undergraduate Literary Conference on Saturday, Oct. 6 in the Center for Natural Science Learning and Research (CNS).

The event will begin with student presentations from 9:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. This year students from IWU and three other universities from the area will be presenting. The presentations will include:

In addition to the student presentations there will be three professional panels

Tucci Professor of Hispanic Studies Dr. Carolyn Nadeau, and Associate Professor of French & Italian Dr. Scott Sheridan
- Law in room E 106 at 2:15 a.m. panelists will include, Meghan E. Leonard, Jon D. McLaughlin, and Judson Strain.
- Education in room E 105 at 2: 15 a.m., the panelists will include Pennie Gray, Christine Pacyk, and Mary Jespersen.

The keynote address by Professor Marcy Dinius will be from 1 p.m. to 2 p.m. in room C 101. Dinius recently joined the faculty at DePaul University in Chicago Ill. as an assistant professor of English. She received a doctorate from Northwestern University. Her book, *The Camera and the Press: American Visual and Print Culture in the Age of the Daguerreotype*, was published in July 2012 by the University of Pennsylvania Press.
