- Background:** Fusing alternative country, roots rock, and folk music with style and intelligence, Lucy Kaplansky presents her thoughtful songs about the human condition with warmth and power, according to her fans. Her recent release, *Every Single Day*, includes songs that deal with hope, sorrow, understanding, and redemption. She can also be heard on recent albums by Nanci Griffith and John Gorka, and has formed the folk group Cry Cry Cry with fellow singer-songwriters Dar Williams and Richard Shindell.

Tracy Grammer recently toured with Joan Baez in the winter of 2002 as a featured soloist during live performances as well as on the album *Drum Hat Buddha*. Previously, she gained fame in the folk world as part of a duo with the late Dave Carter, sharing the stage with artists including Lucinda Williams, the Cowboy Junkies, and Eddie Reader.
