**Event:** Illinois Wesleyan University's Fourth Annual Classic Car Show

**Date:** Oct. 11 (Saturday)

**Time:** 9-11 a.m., display  
11 a.m., three-block parade to the Shirk Center

**Location:** Eckley Quadrangle, Illinois Wesleyan University

**Admission:** Free and open to the public

**Background:** As part of Illinois Wesleyan's Homecoming festivities, approximately 70 antique cars are expected for the show. Such classics as the 1940 Model T, '55 Thunderbird, '56 Chevy and '66 Mustang will be on display. The event is only one of two listed for Saturday in Illinois in the antique car publication *Hemmings Motor News*.

Any pre-1979 vehicle owners are welcome to display. Registration is free and all entries will receive decorative wall plaques. The public will vote on the best of show award. Complimentary juices, coffee, doughnuts and snacks will be available in addition to live music by the IWU Titan Band.

A short parade down Park Street to the Shirk Center, 302 Emerson St., Bloomington, will conclude the show. Cars will be positioned by decade and IWU alums are encouraged to walk with the car that represents their graduation year.
