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Shakespeare Comedy to Take Mainstage at IWU

BLOOMINGTON, III. – Illinois Wesleyan's School of Theatre Arts will present one of Shakespeare's darker comedies, *Measure For Measure* on Nov. 8-12 at 8 p.m. and Nov. 13 at 2 p.m. in the McPherson Theatre, 2 Ames Plaza East, Bloomington.

Directed by IWU Visiting Assistant Professor of Theatre Arts Tom Quinn, *Measure For Measure* is said to put justice itself on trial. Known as one of Shakespeare's "problem plays," it leaves the audience with unanswered morality questions and defies being categorized with Shakespeare's other comedies.

The play follows the story of Duke Vincentio of Vienna, who places his power temporarily in the stern and unmerciful hands of Lord Angelo. Though he pretends to leave for a long journey, the Duke actually remains in the city, disguised as a friar, where he tries to prevent the death of Claudio, a young man who had been put in jail for impregnating the woman Claudio promised to marry. All the while, Claudio's sister Isabella, a young woman preparing to join a convent, pleads with Lord Angelo to free her brother, though the strict ruler will only do so if Isabella loses her chastity to him. Through these struggles, the Duke learns that justice must always be tempered with mercy and understanding.

General admittance tickets for the show are \$6 for the performances on November 8, 9, 10, and 13 and \$8 for the performances on November 11 and 12.
