Friedman received his bachelor of fine arts degree from California College of Arts & Crafts and is currently represented by Habatat Gallery in Chicago. An active educator, Friedman has lectured at universities throughout the United States and has traveled repeatedly to teach in Japan.

Friedman has been published in *New Art Examiner*, *Glass Magazine*, *New Glass*, *New York Times Arts Section*, *Chicago Magazine*, *Chicago Tribune Arts in the City*, and *Chicago Sun Times Art Section*. In 1996, he received the Chicago Artists' International Grant to teach and exhibit in Japan.

"My work deals with containment; the repackaging and controlling of objects, events or forces of nature, to present them in a way that brings attention to their inherent potent symbolism," Friedman writes on his Web site at <http://lancefriedmansculpture.com>. "Giving these symbols order where none is usually present forces the viewer to approach otherwise mundane familiarity with a new immediacy of attention."
