BLOOMINGTON, Ill.--Illinois Wesleyan University sophomore violin and voice performance major Julie Pusch, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Jerry W. Pusch of Racine, Wis., performed *Vieuxtemp's Concerto No. 5 for Violin* at the Henry Charles Memorial Concerto-Aria Concert on Friday, Feb. 11.

The concert was held at the Scottish Rite Temple, 110 E. Mulberry St., Bloomington.

Pusch has performed with the Kiwanis Youth Symphony, the Milwaukee Youth Symphony Orchestra and the Wisconsin State Honors' Orchestra. She has also participated in the Ameropa Music Festival and the MidAmerica Chamber Music Institute.
