Franko Goldman.

Roger Garrett, IWU assistant professor of clarinet/music education, is conductor of the Symphonic Winds. Garrett has been a professor at IWU since 1988, and graduated with distinction from the University of Michigan with multiple degrees in music education with extensive study in the areas of clarinet performance and instrumental conducting.

Before coming to IWU, Garrett taught instrumental music in the public schools of Longview, Washington and Bozeman,

Montana.
