## Life as a Latino in the Midwest

BLOOMINGTON, Ill. – The Council for Latin American Student Enrichment (C.L.A.S.E.) will host a presentation by Adalberto J. Pinelo entitled "A Lifetime as a Latino and a Latin Americanist in the Conservative Midwest." The event will take place on Thursday, April 13 at 7 p.m. in room E103 in the Center for Natural Science (201 E Beecher St, Bloomington).

This event is free and open to the public.

Now retired, Pinelo holds a doctorate in political science from the University of Massachusetts and has taught at Northern Kentucky University for over 33 years. He is the author of the book, *The Multinational Corporation as a Force in Latin America: A Case Study of the International Petroleum Company in Peru*. He held a Fulbright grant to lecture in Peru, where he taught alongside current Peruvian President Alejandro Toledo.

Chairman of the Department of Political Science at Northern Kentucky University for 11 years, Pinelo also served as president of the Faculty Senate and president of the Kentucky Conference of the American Association of University Professors (AAUP). He has also served as President of the Midwest Association of Latin American Studies.
