- Dahlheim will spend the day with the students, coaching them on their particular songs. The public is invited to attend the coaching sessions throughout the day; these too, will be held in Westbrook Auditorium (10:00 -12:00 a.m., and 1:30 - 3:30 p.m.). In the evening, Dahlheim will accompany the students during the concert.
- Dr. Carren Moham, assistant professor of voice at IWU, will offer introductory remarks about the evening's song literature.
