Multicultural Lecture Series to Cover State of Economy

BLOOMINGTON, III. – The Multicultural Lecture Series, sponsored by the Office of Multicultural Student Affairs and the Multicultural Center, will begin its third semester of faculty lectures on Wednesday, Jan. 21. Michael Seeborg, Robert S. Eckley Distinguished Professor of Economics, will deliver an address titled "The Recession: Who Caused It and Who is Getting Hurt?"

Seeborg's lecture, which will take place at 12 p.m. in the Davidson Room of the Memorial Center (104 E. University St.), is free and open to the public.

The Multicultural Lecture Series seeks to address cross-cultural issues from various academic disciplines. For the series, Illinois Wesleyan faculty are invited to "give a lecture related to an aspect of multiculturalism from the vantage point of their respective disciplines," said Nicole Brown-Davis, director of the Office of Multicultural Student Affairs.
