School of Theatre Arts to Perform World Premiere Workshop Musical

BLOOMINGTON, III. – Illinois Wesleyan University's School of Theatre Art's BFA in Music Theatre is presenting the world premiere of Lawrence Rush's musical, *Winter of the Fall*. The performance will take place Saturday April 25, at 7:30 p.m. in the E. Melba Johnson Kirkpatrick Laboratory Theatre ((304 E. Graham St., Bloomington). A talk back session with Rush will be held on Sunday, April 26 at 2:00 p.m. also in the Laboratory Theatre. Both events are free and open to the public.

Written by Rush and directed by Assistant Professor of Theatre Arts Scott Susong, Winter of the Fall tells the story of the last days of Nicolai and Elene Ceaucescu as dictators of Romania in 1989, 20 years ago. As a 1997 Richard Rodgers Award finalist, Winter of the Fall has won the honor of receiving two readings in New York City, but has never before been staged. Rush has written three new songs for this premiere performance.

Rush, who currently lives n New York City, is a composer, lyricist, and librettist, who wrote his first song at age ten. While in high school, he became the youngest member of the performance group, *The Young Americans*. Rush then attended California State University in Nothridge, and graduated with a degree in music with a vocal performance concentration. After college, he moved to San Francisco where he became the youngest full-time member of the *San Francisco Opera* chorus. While in San Francisco Rush performed many opera and music theatre roles, wrote lyrics and music for his first musical, *Waiting at Patroni's*, and started writing *Winter of Fall*. Other pieces written by Rush include, *The Long walk to Forever*, a mini-musical based on a short story by author Kurt Vonnegut, and *Pride and Prejudice*, a musical adaptation on Jayne Austen's novel. *Pride and Prejudice* is also a 2008 Richard Rogers Award finalist.
