Comedian Dave Coulier Set to Entertain at Illinois Wesleyan University

BLOOMINGTON, Ill. -- Many students at Illinois Wesleyan grew up watching actor/comedian/voice-over artist Dave Coulier on the ABC television series, "Full House." Now, they have a chance to be entertained by his story-telling, voices, sound effects and characters on Friday, Jan. 16, at 8 p.m. in the Hansen Student Center, 300 Beecher St., Bloomington.

Coulier's appearance, which is co-sponsored by Illinois Wesleyan's Residential Hall Association and the Office of Student Activities, is free and open to the public. Although Coulier (pronounced Cool-YAY) is probably best known for his work on "Full House," which aired for eight seasons, he followed that success as host of the series "America's Funniest People," which ran on ABC for four seasons. He also hosted ABC's "The World's Funniest Videos," and "Out of Control" for Nickelodeon, and recently released his first family video set entitled "Weaver Beaver and Friends."

Highly regarded for his voice-over talents, Coulier's additional credits include many Saturday morning cartoon favorites, including "Scooby Doo," the re-syndicated version of "The Jetsons," the "Muppet Babies," and "The Real Ghostbusters" cartoon.

In the near future, Coulier will also do voice-overs in several "Felix The Cat" animated feature films for video. His voice talents have also been featured on "Dexter's Laboratory" on the Cartoon Network, as well as "The Zeta Project" for Warner Bros.

Currently, Coulier can be seen hosting Animal Planet's new hit television series, "Animal Kidding" and performing stand-up comedy.

Coulier's stand-up act has earned him appearances on "The Tonight Show," and the HBO series "Detroit Comedy Jam" and "Comic Relief." He continues to enjoy sold-out performances of his act across the country and is now touring college campuses.
