Graduating Art Students Display Works at Illinois Wesleyan University

BLOOMINGTON, Ill. – An upcoming exhibition in the Merwin and Wakeley Galleries at Illinois Wesleyan University will showcase works by students graduating this year with Bachelor of Fine Arts and Bachelor of Arts degrees in art.

The B.F.A./B.A. Senior Exhibitions will be displayed April 3-20 in the Merwin and Wakeley Galleries of the Joyce Eichhorn Ames School of Art, 6 Ames Plaza West, Bloomington, Ill. Gallery hours are 12-4 p.m. Monday-Friday, 7-9 p.m. Tuesday evenings, and 1-4 p.m. Saturday and Sunday. The exhibitions are free and open to the public.

All areas of the University's art program will be represented, including painting, drawing, printmaking, graphic design, photography, ceramics and sculpture. The exhibition will feature work by the following art majors, who are graduating with the degree of B.F.A.:

A reception in conjunction with the Illinois Wesleyan University Family Weekend will be held on Saturday, April 17, from 1-3 p.m. in the galleries. Senior honors and awards will be presented at 2 p.m. on this day.

Awards include the Ames Library Purchase Award, now in its 9th year. The Ames Library will purchase a work from the senior show to be part of its permanent display collection. The Illinois Wesleyan social sciences faculty also will support a similar purchase award for a piece to be displayed in the Center for Liberal Arts building.

Also on April 17, an art sale in the Ames School of Art building will offer for sale ceramic works by Therese O'Halloran, adjunct instructor of art, and her students; prints and mixed media works by Melissa Haviland, adjunct assistant professor of art, and her students; and glass pieces by Kevin Strandberg, associate professor of art.
