BLOOMINGTON, Ill.—Ben Blozan, instructor and performer in the Illinois Wesleyan University School of Music's piano preparatory department, will present a recital Saturday, Mar. 27, 1999.

The 2 p.m. performance will be in IWU's Evelyn Chapel, 1301 N. Park St., Bloomington. There is no admission charge.

The concert program includes Sergei Prokofiev's "Sonata no. 2 in d minor,"

Maurice Ravel's "Jeux d'eau" and "Pavanne pour une infante defunte," three of Frederic

Chopin's "Nocturnes" and Alberto Ginastera's "Danzas Argentinas."

Blozan, who received a masters in piano pedagogy from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign in 1993, is in his sixth year at IWU. He has performed extensively as a soloist and collaborative pianist throughout the East Coast and the Midwest.
