White House Meeting

IWU Nursing Head to Attend Clinton Health-Care Reform Session BLOOMINGTON, Ill.--The director of the School of Nursing at Illinois Wesleyan University will attend a White House meeting tomorrow (April 20) on President Bill Clinton's plan to overhaul the nation's health-care system.

Donna Hartweg, an associate professor and director of IWU's School of Nursing, is one of 50 deans of colleges of nursing invited to the 8:30 a.m. to noon (EDT) session of the White House Health-Care Task Force. The session will be chaired by presidential aide Ira Magaziner.

The meeting will take place in the Old Executive Office Building, which is part of the White House complex.

The Clinton administration plans to unveil its health-care reform proposals next month. The reform plan is closely linked to efforts to control health-care costs and extend coverage to those lacking health insurance.

The health-care reform effort is headed by First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton.
