IWU Poll Results: McLean County State's Attorney's Race

BLOOMINGTON, Ill.--Incumbent McLean County State's Attorney Charles Reynard is leading challenger Pat Brady 46 percent to 28 percent, according to a new poll by Illinois Wesleyan University students.

However, the poll indicates that 25 percent of those canvassed are undecided in the McLean County State's Attorney's race.

The March 10-11 stratified poll, conducted by students in an IWU research methods class taught by Tarl Renner, associate professor and chairperson of political science, surveyed 638 persons. It's margin of error is plus or minus 4 percent.
