BLOOMINGTON, Ill.--Anke Schittenhelm, visiting assistant professor of violin at Illinois Wesleyan University, will present a faculty recital at 8 p.m., April 28, in Evelyn Chapel, 1301 N. Park St.

The program is free and open to the public.

Schittenhelm, concertmaster of the Hof Symphony in Hof, Germany, is teaching at IWU this term, while Vadim Mazo, associate professor of music, is on leave. She also is directing the IWU Camerata, a chamber music orchestra.

Schittenhelm's program will begin with the Bach Sonata for Solo Violin, in G minor, BWV 1001.

She will be joined for the rest of the recital by organist David Gehrenbeck, professor of organ and sacred music, in performing the Handel Sonata in D major for Violin and Basso Continuo, HWV 371; the Bach Sonata in C minor for Violin and Clavier, BWV 1017, and Fantasie for Violin and Organ, op. 49, by the contemporary German composer, Karl Hoeller.
