BLOOMINGTON, Ill.--Illinois Wesleyan University will be "swingin" this week with two jazz concerts.

The Limited Edition will take center stage tomorrow (April 21), when the jazz choral ensemble presents its annual spring concert, entitled, "All that Jazz." The group is directed by Barrington Coleman, assistant professor of voice.

The concert, which is free and open to the public, is at 8 p.m. in Westbrook Auditorium, Presser Hall, 303 E. University St.
